### Brandeis Conejo Valley Chapter Proudly Presents Los Angeles Times writer, Public Radio and TV host, author, winner of 2 Pulitzers and 6 Emmys

## PATT MORRISON

Patt Morrison is best known as a longtime reporter and columnist for the Los Angeles Times, where she has won numerous awards, including a share of two Pulitzer Prizes. In addition to the Times, Patt is read, heard, and seen in many other places. She is a regular commentator on National Public Radio's "Morning Edition" and has published a bestselling book on the Los Angeles River. Morrison is frequently interviewed about Southern California on the BBC and other television and radio programs, and was a founding host of "Life & Times" on KCET-TV, for which she won six Emmys

and six Golden Mike awards. A Senior Fellow in the Luskin School of Public Affairs at UCLA, Morrison was featured on the cover of "TALKERS Magazine" as one of the "heavy hundred" of the nation's talk radio hosts – a first for a public radio host. Among her other honors: Pink's, the famous Los Angeles hot dog stand, has a veggie dog named after her! (read one of her stories on page 4)

could see how important and necessary Brandeis' Sustaining the Mind Campaign is and the part our chapter plays in providing funds for vital research.



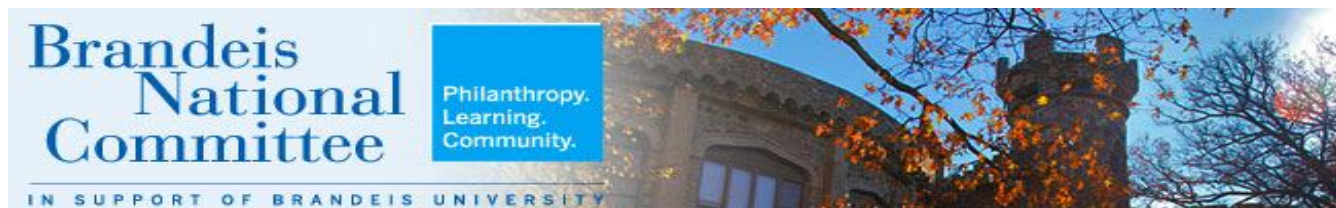

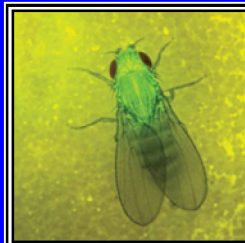


## BNC Mission Statement:

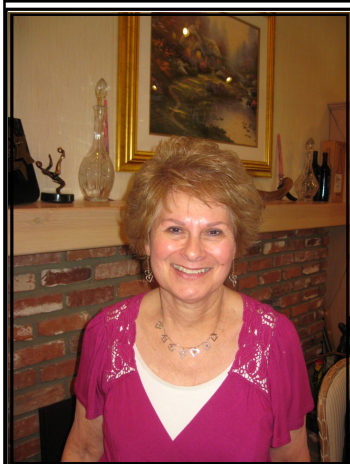

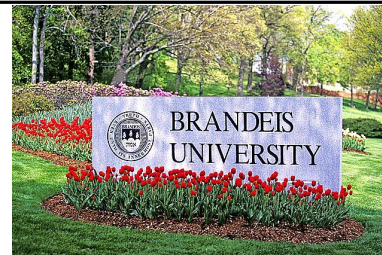

## Defense lawyer Leonard Goodman elected to Board

Chicago veteran criminal defense attorney **Leonard C. Goodman** was elected to a four-year term on the Brandeis Board of Trustees in May. He is also a member of the **Board of Overseers** at the **Heller School for Social Policy and Management**.



Goodman has practiced law for more than 20 years, winning major criminal cases at every level of the Illinois state and federal court systems. After beginning his career at Jenner & Block, he left to establish his own practice as well as to undertake pro bono defense work.

He has won awards for his work on behalf of the wrongfully convicted and has taken on many high-profile clients and challenging cases. Currently, Goodman is representing former Illinois Gov. Rod Blagojevich on the appeal to his political corruption conviction. Last fall in a presentation at the Heller School entitled, "Who's Afraid of Indefinite Detention?", he detailed his representation of an Afghan man detained at Guantanamo Bay without charges or evidence of wrongdoing.

"The work that Len does/did for Guantanamo Bay prisoners is absolutely essential to making sure that the human rights of his clients and of prisoners all over the globe are recognized," says **Anita Hill**, a senior advisor to the provost and professor of social policy, law and women's studies. "This work is symbolic of Len's values and the cases that he takes. Len is absolutely committed to representing clients who are poor, whose positions may be unpopular, or who in other ways are marginalized."

Goodman also teaches federal criminal law as an adjunct professor at DePaul University.

### What Is Rosh Hashanah?

It is the anniversary of the creation of Adam and Eve, the first man and woman, and their first actions toward the realization of man-kind's role in G-d's world.

### What Is Yom Kippur?

Yom Kippur is the holiest day of the year--the day on which we are closest to G-d and to the quintessence of our own souls. It is the Day of Atonement--"For on this day He will forgive you, to purify you, that you be cleansed from all your sins before G-d" (Leviticus 16:30).

For nearly twenty-six hours--from several minutes before sunset on Tishrei 9 to after nightfall on Tishrei 10--we "afflict our souls": we abstain from food and drink, do not wash or anoint our bodies, do not wear leather footwear, and abstain from marital relations.

### What Is Sukkot?

For forty years, as our ancestors traversed the Sinai Desert, following the Exodus from Egypt, miraculous "clouds of glory" surrounded and hovered over them, shielding them from the dangers and discomforts of the desert. Ever since, we remember G-d's kindness and reaffirm our trust in His providence by dwelling in a sukkah--a hut of temporary construction with a roof covering of branches--for the duration of the Sukkot festival (on the Jewish calendar Tishrei 15-21). For seven days and nights, we eat all our meals in the sukkah and otherwise regard it as our home. Sukkot - September 18 - 25, 2013



### What Is Simchat Torah?

After the seven-day holiday of Sukkot, we celebrate an *independent* one-day holiday, called "Shemini Atzeret." Outside of Israel, as is the case with almost all Biblical holidays, an extra day is added to this holiday (see Why are holidays celebrated an extra day in the Diaspora?), and this day is known as "Simchat Torah." Although this holiday directly follows Sukkot, it is not actually part of Sukkot.

### What Is Hanukkah (Chanukah)?

Chanukah commemorates the rededication of the Temple in Jerusalem after a group of Jewish warriors defeated the occupying mighty Greek armies.
