On The Town Divas Group: The "Diva's" group recently visited a 911 center and would like to share some very important information that we believe will benefit every one.

911 can be dialed from any phone, even disconnected, absolutely free. It should only be used for an emergency: a crime in progress and/or a life threatening situation requiring the Police, Paramedics or Fire Department.

For non-emergency police assistance dial 311 or 211 for the city of Los Angeles and Los Angeles County or 1-877-275-5273 (1-877-ASK-LAPD). It would be helpful to have these numbers programmed into your phones.

Everyone should have a land line phone in their home connected directly to the phone socket. In case of an emergency, when the electricity is cut off, this phone will still work. If you are calling from your home to the 911 center they will automatically have your address and phone number. Cell phones can only be traced to the tower closest to your location at that time.

Program I.C.E. (In Case of Emergency) with the person's name and phone number who you want to be contacted in case you have been in an accident and you are unconscious. The police or paramedics can contact this person using the I.C.E. programmed number.

If you have a medical emergency it is recommended that you call 911 immediately rather than drive the person to the hospital. **You can't drive and administer CPR.**

I.C.E. (IN CASE OF EMERGENCY)

Paramedics will turn to a non-responsive victim's cell phone for clues to that person's identity. You can make their job much easier by performing a simple task that they are asking everyone to do: ICE. ICE stands for In Case of Emergency. Add an entry in the contacts list in your cell phone under ICE containing the name and phone number of the person you want emergency services to call on your behalf. This will save them a lot of time and have your loved one contacted quickly. It only takes a few moments of your time to do. Paramedics know what ICE means and they look for it immediately. ICE your cell phone NOW!
