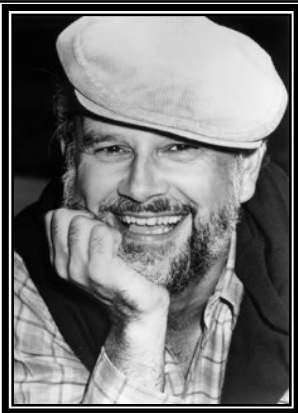
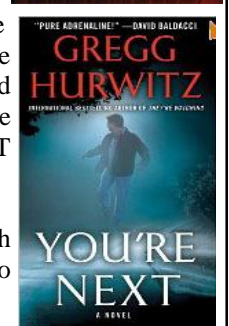
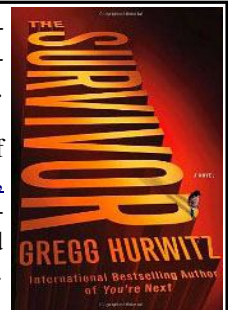
Gregg Hurwitz is the New York Times bestselling author of 12 thrillers, including *Trust No One*, *They're Watching*, *You're Next* and his 2012 release, *The Survivor*.

Hurwitz grew up in the San Francisco Bay Area. While completing a bachelor of arts degree from [Harvard University](#) ('95) and a master's from [Trinity College, Oxford](#) in [Shakespearean tragedy](#) ('96), he wrote his first novel. He was the undergraduate scholar-athlete of the year at Harvard for pole vaulting and played college soccer in England, where he was a Knox fellow.

His books have been nominated for numerous awards including best novel of the year by the International Thriller Writers and the Ian Fleming Steel Dagger. He has written screenplays for Disney, Paramount, Warner Brothers and MGM and has written comics for Marvel and DC Comics having recently taken over as the

writer for the *Batman: The Dark Knight* comic series. He is currently working on a drama project with TNT based on his Tim Rackley book franchise which he is executive producing for Sony Pictures TV.

In the course of researching his thrillers, he has snuck onto demolition ranges with Navy SEALs, swam with sharks in the Galápagos, and gone undercover into mind-control cults. He has written and produced season two of the TV show "V".



"Have Fun"...those were the words **Gene Perret** used when he started Round Table as a way for comedy writers and performers to connect and learn more about the business. After 30 years we are thrilled to still be in the position to help others pursue their dreams.

Gene Perret has been a comedy writer since the early 1960's working for comedians such as Bill Cosby and Phyllis Diller. He's been a television comedy writer and producer since 1968. Perret has earned 7 Emmy nominations, including one for original music, and 2 Writer's Guild Award nominations. He has captured three Emmy awards and one Writer's Guild Award as part of the Carol Burnett Show writing staff. Gene produced "Welcome Back, Kotter," "Three's Company," and "The Tim Conway Show."

Gene also worked on Bob Hope's writing staff for 28 years, from 1969 until the comic's retirement - many of those years as Hope's head writer. During that time, Gene wrote for all of Bob's personal appearances and TV Specials, traveling with the Bob Hope troupe to the war zones of Beirut, the Persian Gulf, Saudi Arabia, and on a peace time military jaunt around the world.

CIO Report

Brandeis joins consortium to offer online learning

Brandeis and nine other leading universities are planning to launch an innovative online education program next fall.

The new program, **Semester Online**, will be the first to offer undergraduate students rigorous, online courses for credit from a consortium of universities. The program is delivered through a virtual classroom environment and interactive platform developed by 2U, a private online education company based in Landover, Maryland.

Beginning in the fall of 2013, Semester Online will be available to academically qualified students attending consortium schools and other schools across the country. Information about Semester Online courses and the application process will be available in early 2013.

Joining Brandeis as founding members of the consortium are Duke University, Emory University, Northwestern Univ., University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, University of Notre Dame, Univ. of Rochester, Vanderbilt Univ., Wake Forest Univ. and Washington Univ. in St. Louis. The consortium anticipates adding a small number of institutions prior to the launch.

Students will be able to work, travel, participate in off-campus research programs or manage personal commitments that in the past would have meant putting their studies on hold.

Eat, Drink and Be Merry

Purim is a [Jewish holiday](#) that commemorates the deliverance of the [Jewish](#) people in the ancient [Persian Empire](#) from destruction in the wake of a plot by [Haman](#), a story recorded in the [Biblical Book of Esther](#) (*Megillat Esther*). **Purim** 2013 begins in the evening of Saturday, February 23rd and ends in the evening of Sunday, the 24th.

Purim is celebrated by giving mutual gifts of food and drink (*mishloach manot*), giving charity to the poor (*mattanot la-eyyonim*), a celebratory meal (*se'udat Purim*), and public recitation of the Scroll of Esther (*keriat ha-megillah*). Other customs include drinking wine, wearing of masks and costumes, public celebration. **Purim** should be celebrated with a **special festive meal on Purim day**, at which family and friends gather together to rejoice in the Purim spirit. It is a mitzvah to make everyone happy at this meal. As the traditions calls, here is something you can read to your friends:

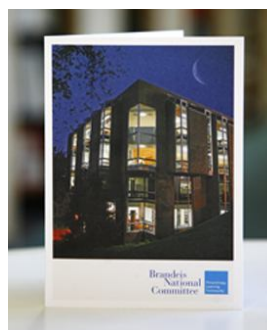
