INTERESTING FACTS FROM BRANDEIS UNIVERSITY

MARCH CIO REPORT

This is the story of Abl and Src — two nearly identical protein kinases which are key regulators of cell function whose evolution may hold the key to unlocking new, highly specific cancer drugs.

Dorothee Kern, Brandeis professor of biochemistry and Howard Hughes Medical Institute investigator, unraveled the journey of these two proteins utilizing over one billion years of evolution, pinpointing the exact evolutionary shifts that caused cancer drug Gleevec to bind well with one and poorly with the other. This new approach to researching enzymes and their binding sites may have a major impact on the development of rational drugs to fight cancer.

Tom Friedman continues to support Brandeis University

Brandeis' Faculty Against the Climate Threat (FACT) invites the entire Brandeis community to join them in a week-long series of climate change education, centered around the award-winning TV series *Years of Living Dangerously*, and culminating in a conversation with Brandeis alum and three-time Pulitzer Prize winning New York Times columnist Tom Friedman on March 2 who will answer questions about the urgency of climate action.

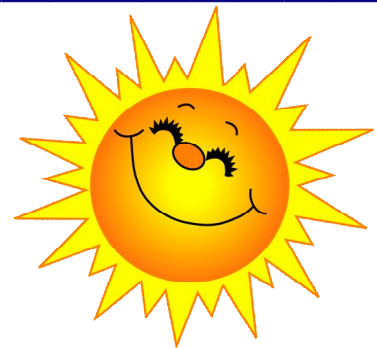

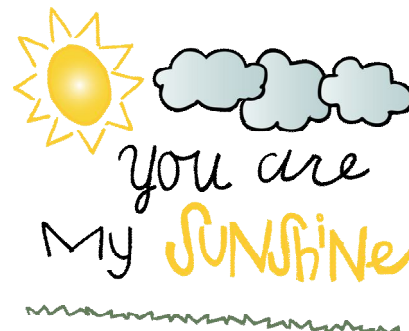

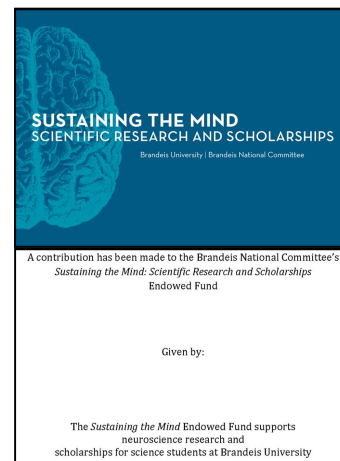
