## Presented by **Associate Professor Of Biology** Melissa Kosinski-Collins, PhD

Professor Melissa Kosinski-Collins is an Associate Professor of Biology at Brandeis University. Professor Kosinski-Collins received her Ph.D. from MIT studying protein folding and aggregation in the laboratory of Jonathan King. Professor Kosinski-Collins completed a postdoc in Graham Walker's HHMI Education

Group contributing to the development of tools, such as StarBiochem, for teaching undergraduate biology courses and interactive exercises for Experimental Biology (MIT course 7.02) and Introductory Biology (MIT course 7.01). At Brandeis, Professor Kosinski-Collins has redesigned and taught a variety of courses including the introductory biology laboratory series, nonmajors courses on protein folding diseases, graduate classes in protein structure and molecular biology and education courses on assessment and learning in science education.

Melissa will explain to us why our brain functions perfectly well for 60 years and then suddenly begins to self destruct at an alarming rate at our age.

A Visit to Syrian refugees in Jordan is an eye opener Chen Arad and Natan Odenheimer met as roommates in their first year at Brandeis last year, and have become good friends. This summer, Arad visited Odenheimer at the Jordanian University in Amman, where he was studying Arabic. Together, they traveled to the Syrian-Jordanian border, where they met two families of Syrian refugees who shared their stories. Feeling that there is a lack of personal first-hand accounts by Israelis in the Israeli media regarding the conflict in Syria, they decided to write an article describing their experience. It was subsequently published as a front page article on "ynet," the mostly widely read news website in Israel. Arad translated it into English for Brandeis NOW. 

# "Sustaining the Mind"

This year, the Brandeis National Committee's philanthropic focus is a \$3 million, 3-year initiative called "Sustaining the Mind: Scientific Research and Scholarships," which is aimed at research on neurodegenerative diseases and establishing an endowed scholarship fund for students in the sciences.

Brandeis researchers in more than 50 laboratories are dedicated to the study of neurological disorders such as Alzheimer's disease, ALS (Lou Gehrig's disease) and Parkinson's disease. The worldwide incidence of dementia (including Alzheimer's disease), currently exceeds 35 million and is predicted to double every 20 years.
