Brandeis University Professor
Dr. Don Katz

From the Brandeis University Psychology and Neuroscience Department



Dr Katz will discuss: What makes us Like the Foods that we like?

The learned and lively Dr. Katz will discuss how our brains combine this welter of information such that most of us end up liking sweets, some of us end up liking beer, and all of our tastes are subject to change. He is currently an Associate Professor of Psychology and Neuroscience, studying how context and experience affects taste preferences and neural coding.

“An undergraduate degree in Cognitive and Linguistic Sciences at Brown was followed by a brief stint as a psycholinguist at the Boston Aphasia Research Center, and then by graduate work as a clinical psychologist at Indiana University. There I discovered the Neurobiology of Learning & Memory. My dissertation concerned cerebellar interactions during eyeblink conditioning, which awakened me to the potential value of multi-site recording technology. I went to Duke University Medical School to do a post-doc with Miguel Nicolelis and Sid Simon, which allowed me to apply this technology, first to the somatosensory and then the gustatory system. It is this last work that I have brought to Brandeis.” *Dr. Donald Katz*

Recently the Asian Food Network tapped **K.C. Hayes, a Brandeis Professor** for a documentary to learn more about his work with dietary fats. Dr Hayes is a professor of biology and nutrition and director of the Foster Biomedical Research Laboratories. Concern about the obesity epidemic sweeping across the world has prompted the Asian food channel to create a documentary investigating healthy diets. For nearly 40 years, Hayes has been studying the effects of dietary fat and oils and how they are metabolized. His specific interest has been in cardiovascular disease as affected by diabetes and obesity. He has also directed the research behind the Smart Balance blended-fat products, which help reduce cholesterol, and technologies to produce cholesterol-lowering soy and cow's milk.

Brandeis Rises in University Rankings

Brandeis University has once again been named one of top schools and one of the best values in the nation by U.S. News & World Report. Brandeis is 31st among national universities, up three positions from last year. The biggest factors in the 2012 overall rank, include significant improvements in the categories of undergraduate academic reputation, six-year graduation rate and alumni giving rate.

CIO REPORT - Harriet Maran: Brandeis Class of 2015

This fall over 860 first-year students were among those chosen from more than 8,900 applications, the most in Brandeis history. They come from 37 different states and 33 countries. An additional 108 admitted students will arrive in Jan., bringing the total size of the class to about 970. More than 90 percent of the class graduated in the top quarter of their high school class. Approximately 70% of the class is receiving some form of financial aid.

OUR TASTER'S CHOICE BRITISH ETHNIC LUNCHEON

October 4, 2011 our **Taster's Choice** group met at the Crown and Anchor, a British restaurant and pub in Thousand Oaks, CA.

Some of our diners wore traditional clothing. As you can see, hats, several fascinators, white gloves and open smiles on our faces.

We were greeted by the owner, his daughter and a nephew. Together they gave us a small bit of history with each of our courses. The first course was Cornish pasties, which are only authentic when they are made in Cornwall. Also, they were given to tin miners as they were easily carried into the mine. The pasties are sealed with a fork that forms a rim around the pasty, so that fingers made dirty during the morning's work could be used to hold the rim of the food and then the rim was disposed of, not fit to eat.

The second course was the famous Fish n' Chips served wrapped in paper, used to soak up the frying grease and to keep the food warm and crisp. It is absolutely delicious when you add the home made tartar sauce. Other additions to our food were the H.P. (House of Parliament) sauce, a wonderful lightly spiced mustard, and a touch of vinegar.

Our third course was a small Shepherd's Pie. There are many different pies in England named according to the different locals and containing the freshest and best ingredients

from that location. Several names of the pies are: Cottage Pie, Steak and Kidney Pie, Pork Pie and Cumberland pie.

Fourth course was a Steak and Mushroom Pie followed by a dessert of traditional hot apple crumble with custard.

It was a pleasure to see our group enjoying the food, the history lessons, the friendship and the afternoon in England.

CIO REPORT (Harriet Maran)

A team of researchers from the Petsko Ringe and Pochapsky laboratories at Brandeis University have produced and determined the structure of alpha-synuclein, a key protein associated with Parkinson's disease.

While people with Parkinson's disease exhibit obvious symptoms such as tremors and weakness of face and throat muscles, definitive diagnosis of Parkinson's comes post-mortem, when alpha-synuclein proteins become denatured and form clumps call Lewy bodies in the brain.

The scientists want to find out what form alpha-synuclein is in before it turns into Lewy body clumps, figuring that it is possible to stabilize, the progression of Parkinson's disease could either be slowed down or reversed.


