# **Teen Sexual Harassment Study**

The Shuster Institute for Investigative Journalism at Brandeis University and NOW, the PBS public affairs program, are working together to present an investigation of teen sexual harassment in the workplace. The program, "Teen Sexual Harassment at Work," will feature the reporting of E. J. Graff's, the Schuster Institute's Associate Director and senior researcher. According to Graff's research, teenagers are in more danger from sexual predators at their part-time jobs than through the Internet. This has been largely unreported, but now young women and men have been coming forward to tell their stories.

We collect sample size toiletries, disposable diapers, detergents, toys, and bicycles, even old bicycles that need some repair. 


