Brandeis National Committee History

Located in Waltham, Massachusetts, Brandeis University is ranked in the top tier of universities in the country. Founded in 1948 and named for the late Justice Louis Dembitz Brandeis of the U.S. Supreme Court, it is the only nonsectarian, Jewish-founded university in the country, known for its academic excellence and ideals of social justice. At the same time as Brandeis founding, eight women from Boston, all leaders in the community, were asked to help in supporting this new university. They were given the task of building on the collection of 2,000 books in the Library, which was housed in a converted horse

stable. The dedication and perseverance of these women, who now called themselves the National Women's Committee continues today, sixty-one years later, as the Brandeis National Committee. With over 70 chapters nationwide and over 39,000 members, BNC is one of the largest and most successful "friends of a library organizations in the world. Over the years, we have placed over one million books in the Brandeis libraries, and raised over \$100 million for Brandeis University and its libraries, scholarship and research. Brandeis University has become one of the youngest private research universities, with groundbreaking exploration in neurodegenerative and age-related diseases.

Our Conejo Valley Chapter, is proud to be a part of this wonderful endeavor. The funds we raise from our events and study groups help to support the development and expansion of Brandeis's Libraries. They are able to purchase books and research journals, restore and preserve books and film, develop information technology, and hire student work assistants. While most of us did not attend Brandeis University or have never visited, we are dedicated supporters to a university that prides itself in bringing together many people of different ethnic, religious and cultural backgrounds.

Our second Ethnic Dining Study Group meet was April 5th at the Russian Tea House Kalinka, in Encino, planned by the "Yfat-Alvira" Team



Our third Ethnic Dining event was an amazing experience. We were told that to be invited to a Russian Tea means one must refrain from eating for a week. We found out why. The table was filled to the edges with lovely, divine, traditional Russian cuisine.

We had: A traditional Russian salad.

Oladi- traditional Russian Pancakes, Belini-big, thin Russian Pancakes served with sour cream and home made jam.

Pelmeni - Dumplings filled with meat

Wonderful sweets and Vechernii Chai from the house of Tsar Romanov himself (special evening tea).

The Tea is served in two stages. One, you pour a little of the strong brewed tea and two, you add water to your taste. The taste of the full strength tea is delicious as well and is served with Bubliki and Sushki (very dry round sweets, Russian use to make into garland and wear around the neck at the Tea Ceremony).

Together, we relaxed and enjoyed our traditional Russian Tea. The conversations commenced the moment we all met and continued long after our Tea Party was officially over. We learn that in Russia, traditionally, dinning table is a main room where guest are greeted and the goods continue to come for hours and hours, as part of entertainment.
