
We Are Honored To Present
Brandeis University Professor

Dr. Antler

Professor of American Jewish History and Culture

Joyce Antler is a professor of American Jewish History and Culture and Women's and Gender Studies at Brandeis University.

Joyce Antler is a social and cultural historian, with special interests in the history of American women; history-as-theater; the history of education, and women's biography. She has written widely on the history of women, and on Jewish women, and is currently working on a book on women's liberation and Jewish identity. She is also a prize-winning historical dramatist, and works with her students to create original documentary dramas on matters of social urgency.



One of her very well known books: ***You Never Call! You Never Write! A History of the Jewish Mother***, provides an illuminating and often amusing history of one of the best-known figures in popular culture--the Jewish Mother over.

She reminds us of a time when Jewish mothers were admired for their tenacity and nurturance, as in the early twentieth-century image of the "Yiddische Mama," a sentimental figure popularized by entertainers such as George Jessel, Al Jolson, and Sophie Tucker, and especially by Gertrude Berg, whose amazingly successful "Molly Goldberg" ruled American radio and television for over 25 years. But she also uncovers a new counter-narrative, leading feminist scholars and stand-up comediennes to see the Jewish Mother in positive terms.

A joy to read, *You Never Call, You Never Write* will delight anyone who has ever known or been nurtured by a "Jewish Mother," and it will be a special source of insight for modern parents. As Antler suggests, in many ways, "we are all Jewish Mothers" today.

Tony Goldwyn '82 recalled his days as a Brandeis student. Brandeis alumni and current chapter members in Southern California met the president- President Fitzgerald Grant III of "Scandal" fame, that is.


