The rise of the Third Reich confronted Hollywood with a series of economic, cinematic, and moral problems: How to conduct business with the Nazis and whether to address or ignore Nazism in Hollywood and the coverage of Hitler and his victims in newsreels. There is irony in the fact that in Berlin,

Jews were Hitler's chosen victims; in Hollywood, Jews were titans of industry, esteemed artists and adored stars.

Professor Doherty comes with an impressive background as a Peace Corps volunteer in South Korea, a Fulbright scholar in Seoul, New Zealand and Albania and a Thomas Jefferson Chair in American Studies in the Netherlands, University of Groningen.

In 2005 he was awarded the Academy Film Scholar from the Academy of Motion Pictures Arts and Sciences.

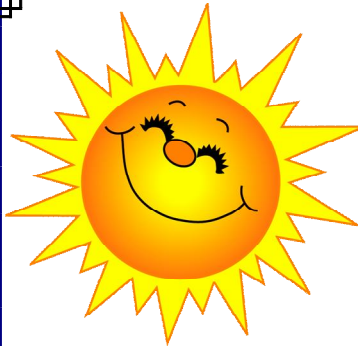

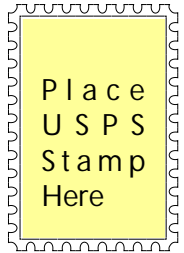
