
We Are Honored To Present
Brandeis University Professor
TOM DOHERTY
Speaking on
“HOLLYWOOD and HITLER”

The rise of the Third Reich confronted Hollywood with an unwelcome set of economic, cinematic, and moral problems – over whether to address or ignore Nazism and over the coverage of Hitler. Hear Professor Doherty’s stimulating and enlightening lecture and discussion on this captivating topic.

Thomas Doherty, a professor of American studies, is a cultural historian with a special interest in Hollywood cinema. He teaches courses in media culture and things American.

In 2005, he received recognition as an Academy Film Scholar from the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences. He serves on the editorial board of Cineaste and edits the film review section for the *Journal of American History*.

Doherty is the author of "Teenagers and Teenpics: The Juvenilization of American Movies in the 1950s" (1988), "Projections of War: Hollywood, American Culture and World War II" (1993), "Pre-Code Hollywood: Sex, Immorality and Insurrection in American Cinema, 1930-1934" (1999), "Cold War, Cool Medium: Television, McCarthyism and American Culture" (2003) and, most recently, "Hollywood's Censor: Joseph I. Breen and the Production Code Administration" (2007).

PRESIDENT: The President shall preside at all meetings of the Chapter and of the Board; shall have general supervision and direction of the affairs of the Chapter; shall appoint all Chairs of Standing Committees (except the Chair of the Nominating Committee, who is elected), and the Chairs and members of all Special Committees except as otherwise provided in the Chapter's Bylaws. The President shall be co-signer with the Treasurer on checks and shall perform all duties generally vested in the office of the President, as specified in the Chapter's Bylaws, or in any vote of the Executive Board.

RECOMMENDED _____

VICE PRESIDENTS: (these positions are usually supported by committees): The Vice Presidents, as designated by the President, shall perform the duties of the President in the President's absence or inability to serve. The Vice Presidents shall perform such other functions as may be assigned to them by the President or the Executive Board.

VICE PRESIDENT, FUNDRAISING: Oversees major fund raising events.

RECOMMENDED _____

VICE PRESIDENT, MEMBERSHIP: Oversees all aspects of membership.

RECOMMENDED _____

COMMUNICATION INFORMATION OFFICER: Disseminates information about Brandeis University to the Board, Study Group Vice Presidents, Newsletter and general membership.

RECOMMENDED _____

VICE PRESIDENTS, STUDY GROUPS (3): Oversee all Study Groups. Assist in starting new Study Groups and placing members in Study Groups. **RECOMMENDED** _____

RECORDING SECRETARY: The Recording Secretary shall keep a record of the meetings of the Chapter, the Board, and functions as specified by the Board. **RECOMMENDED** _____

CORRESPONDING SECRETARY: The Corresponding Secretary shall issue notices of meetings of the Chapter and Board and carry on all correspondence of the Chapter and Board that does not properly belong to other Officers or Chairs.

RECOMMENDED _____

FINANCIAL SECRETARY: The Financial Secretary shall collect and keep an accurate account of the status of all members by way of the chapter roster and shall transmit all funds received to National.

RECOMMENDED _____

TREASURER: The Treasurer shall have custody of the funds of the Chapter and shall deposit same in the name of the Chapter in a Bank of America account. Also keep an accurate record of all monies collected and expended and transmit these funds to BNC on a monthly basis, having deducted allowable sums in accordance with the policies of BNC.

RECOMMENDED _____

NOMINATING COMMITTEE: At the Annual Meeting of the Chapter, a Nominating Committee of seven persons, including a designated Chair, will be elected to serve until the close of the next Annual Meeting. In addition to the seven, an alternate is also elected. Of the seven, one shall be a member of the outgoing committee; three shall be members of the Board, and three chosen from the general membership. **RECOMMENDED:** _____

PARLIAMENTARIAN: The Parliamentarian shall oversee Board meetings to ensure proper parliamentary procedure is followed and shall have the final ruling over any disputed procedure. The Parliamentarian should be knowledgeable in parliamentary procedures and Robert's Rules of Order. **RECOMMENDED** _____

DIRECTORS (4): Directors shall be elected for a three (3) year term commencing July 1, 2010 and concluding on June 30, 2013. Directors are expected to accept a portfolio as a chair or as a committee member.






